# <u>Permit for REMOVAL of Underground Storage Tank(s) and Piping for Petroleum and</u> Hazardous Substances

Permission to remove underground storage tank(s) or piping is hereby granted. Such removal must be in complete accordance with all sections and procedures specified in 41 Illinois Administrative Code Parts 174, 175 and 176. The contractor the permit was issued to shall establish a date certain to perform the UST activity by scheduling the permitted activity through their UST contractor portal account. If the Storage Tank Safety Specialist (STSS) observes evidence of a release, the owner, operator or designated representative of the UST owner/operator must notify the Illinois Emergency Management Agency (IEMA). The incident number shall be given to the STSS prior to his/her leaving the site. After the removal is completed, the owner/operator shall have a site assessment performed by measuring for the presence of a release where contamination is most likely to be present at the UST site. This is in accordance with the Illinois Administrative Code 176.360 (a) regulations and 40 CFR Part 280.72 (a) Federal Register Requirement.

# **Summary of Work**

There are two tanks (15,000 gal and 12,000 gal) located on the north end of the site that were constructed inside bunkers. To acces the tanks, the concrete block and brick side walls of the bunkers will be removed and the tanks exposed. The remaining liquids and sludges will be removed with a vacuum truck and a laborer with a shovel and drum. The atmosphere of the tanks will be checked for explosive vapors, if safe then the tanks will be removed from their settings and placed in an area to open the ends for complete access and cleaning. Once cleaned, the tankes will be cut into managable pieces with an excavator mounted shear. The resulting steel scrap will be haued for recycling. The thire tank (1,500 gal) will be exposed by removing the soils from the top and sides. Once emptied and deemed safe, it will be removed from the ground and cleaned using the same methodologies as described above. The tank will then be cut into scrap and hauled off site for recycling. Note that the two larger tanks (15,000 gal and 12,000 gal are located inside a bunker. The third tank (1,500 gal) is directly buried in the ground.

## **Special Contingencies**

The owner must notify this Office when completion of tank removal has occurred, on the Notification for Underground Storage Tank Form. This form can be obtained at www.sfm.illinois.gov or by calling (217)785-1020. After removal is completed, the owner/operator shall perform a site assessment by measuring for the presence of a release where contamination is most likely to be present at the UST site. This is in accordance with the Illinois Administrative Code 176.360 (a) regulations and 40 CFR Part 280.72 (a) Federal Register Requirement.
