The contractor the permit was issued to shall establish a date certain to perform the UST activity by shall establish a date certain to perform the UST activity by scheduling the permitted activity through their UST contractor portal account If the Storage Tank Safety Specialist (STSS) observes evidence of a release, the owner, operator or designated representative of the UST owner/operator must notify the Illinois Emergency Management Agency (IEMA). The incident number shall be given to the STSS prior to his/her leaving the site.
