

## Permit for ABANDONMENT IN PLACE of Underground Storage Tank(s) and Piping for Petroleum and Hazardous Substances.

Permission to abandon in place underground storage tank(s) or piping is hereby granted. Such abandonment must be in complete accordance with acceptable materials as specified in the Federal Register, Part II Environmental Protection Agency, 40 CFR Parts 280 and 281, and also with all sections of 41 Illinois Administrative Code, Parts 174, 175, and 176. The contractor the permit was issued to or an employee of that contractor (this does not include a subcontractor) shall establish a date certain to perform the UST activity by contacting the Office of the State Fire Marshal, Division of Petroleum and Chemical Safety, by telephone at the Springfield office between 8:30 a.m. and 12:00 p.m., at which time a mutually agreed upon date and time for the UST activity shall be scheduled. **THIS PERMIT IS VALID FOR SIX MONTHS FROM THE APPROVAL DATE**.

## (3) <u>ABANDONMENT IN PLACE OF TANKS:</u>

- (a) Number and size tanks being abandoned: (TK # 2454) 8,000 gallons
- (b) Location of tanks being abandoned: see contingencies section.

## (c) Location of piping being abandoned: See contingencies section and site plan

- (4) This permit is VOID if contamination is revealed during abandonment procedures or if tanks are not as indicated on your granted permit site plan. If contamination is revealed, this abandonment can continue only when the contaminated site section (2) of the certification on site condition has been submitted to our Office.
- (5) <u>SPECIAL CONTINGENCIES</u>: These two sections of piping will be allowed to be abandoned in place without the requirement for a certificate of site condition and site assessment / soil borings along the abandoned runs. This is allowed under Title 35 Environmental Protection Part 734 Petroleum Underground Storage Tanks; specifically under section 734.210(h)(1) and 734.210(h)(2). This is allowed due to the fact the contractor states boring equipment and removal equipment will not fit within the area of the piping that cannot be removed and needs to be abandoned. There is also an electrical box in the way, there are three active additive lines crossing over the 50' section of product lines, and there is a large concrete pad / loading dock over the top of the 25' section. The tank and the remainder of piping will be removed under removal permit #00777-2012REM.
- (6) The owner must notify this Office when completion of tank abandonment has occurred, on the Notification for Underground Storage Tank Form. This form can be obtained at <u>www.sfm.illinois.gov</u> or by calling (217)785-1020.
